Check-out is by **10:00am** on the day of departure. Before you leave, please place all **rubbish and recycling** in the wheelie bins in the **Top Car Park**.

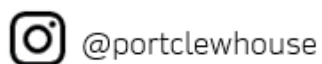

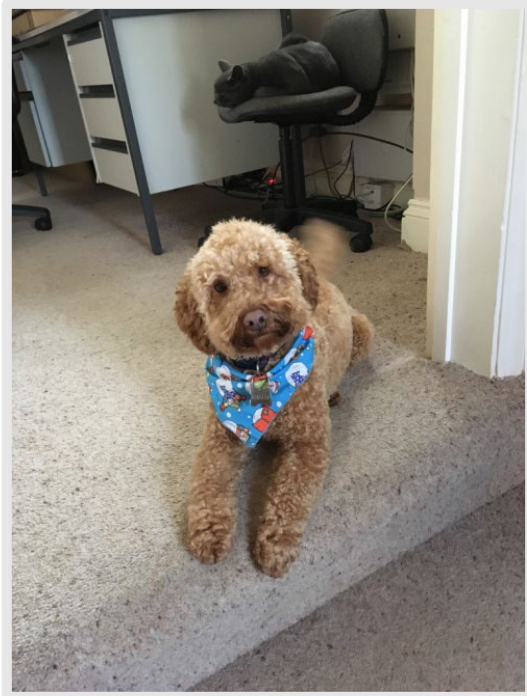

RECYCLING AND WASTE

Please use the Recycling Boxes and bins for all your waste.

BLUE - Cardboard and Paper - All clean paper and cardboard (no glitter).

RED - Metal and Plastic - Clean Tins, Cans, Aerosols, Aluminium Foil, Trays and Tubes (no crisp packets or laminated foil pouches). Clean plastic bottles, tubs, cartons and food trays (no plastic film, no black or brown plastic, no polystyrene or hard plastic.

GREEN - Glass - Clean glass bottles and jars

BLACK - General Waste and Food Waste - All materials which cannot be recycled. At present we are unable to recycle the Food Waste and this can be placed in the Black Bins.

PLACES OF INTEREST

BEACHES

Freshwater East Beach

This is the nearest beach, just half a mile away on foot. It can be reached either by following the main footpath along the road or by taking the winding paths through the burrows that lead directly down to the sand. Whichever route you choose, be prepared for a fairly steep climb back up to Portclew. Alternatively, you can drive down to the car park (SA71 5LY) at the bottom of the hill, where a flat path leads directly onto the beach—ideal for bringing buggies and wheelchairs onto the sand. The swimming here is generally safe, and there are plenty of rock pools and caves to explore. Public toilets are also available.

Distance from Portclew: 3 minutes by car, approx. 0.8 miles

Barafundle Bay

Barafundle is one of Pembrokeshire's most stunning beaches, loved by both locals and visitors for its golden sands and crystal-clear waters. Frequently listed among the best beaches in Britain and even the world, it offers a truly unspoiled setting.

The beach itself isn't accessible by car—the nearest parking is at Stackpole Quay (SA71 5LS). From there, you can reach Barafundle on foot via the Coast Path, either from Stackpole Quay (about 0.5 miles) or Broad Haven South (around 1.3 miles). Access to the beach is via steps from the cliff top, so it's not suitable for pushchairs or wheelchairs. There are no toilet facilities at the beach; the nearest are at the National Trust car park at Stackpole Quay. Next to the car park, you'll also find The Boathouse Tea Rooms, which serves excellent food and refreshments.

Distance from Portclew: 10 minutes by car, approx. 3 miles

Broadhaven South

Broadhaven South is a stunning beach famed for its wide sweep of golden sand, striking Church Rock, and its close proximity to the Bosherton Lily Ponds. It's an ideal spot for swimming, surfing, fishing, or simply enjoying classic beach games like cricket.

You can reach the beach either from the Broad Haven South car park (SA71 5DZ) via a steep path, or by parking in the National Trust car park at Bosherton village (SA71 5DW) and following a relatively flat, mile-long walk around the lily ponds. Toilet facilities are available at both car parks.

Distance from Portclew: 20 minutes by car, approx. 7 miles

Freshwater West

Freshwater West is a vast, sandy beach backed by an impressive expanse of dunes and renowned as one of Wales's premier surfing destinations. It's popular with experienced surfers and regularly hosts major tournaments that attract competitors from around the world. The beach also offers plenty of rock pools to explore and ample space for beach games.

Due to strong swells and powerful currents, swimming here is not recommended for beginners or inexperienced swimmers.

Freshwater West has also starred on the big screen, featuring in *Ridley Scott's Robin Hood* (starring Russell Crowe) and *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows*, where it served as the location for Shell Cottage—the site of Dobby the elf's death and burial.

There are two small car parks (SA71 5AH) close to the beach, with toilet facilities available in the southern car park.

Distance from Portclew: 22 minutes by car, approx. 11 miles

West Angle Bay

West Angle Bay lies about a mile west of Angle village and is an excellent choice for families. The car park (SA71 5BE) is conveniently located right beside the beach, with easy access via a slipway. The bay is perfect for swimming, kayaking, fishing, and exploring the many rock pools. The mix of soft and firm sand makes it ideal for ball games and kite flying. On site, you'll find the Wavecrest Café, which serves delicious food, and there are toilet facilities close to the beach. In nearby Angle village, the Hibernia Inn offers excellent meals and a welcoming atmosphere.

Distance from Portclew: 29 minutes, approx. 14 miles

Manorbier

Manorbier Beach is a sandy, south-westerly facing bay popular with surfers and families alike. Framed by rugged cliffs and sand dunes, it's rich in rock pools to explore and offers stunning views of the impressive Norman castle that overlooks the bay, which is usually open daily to visitors.

Swimmers should take care, as there can be strong currents in the water. A nearby car park (SA70 7SY) provides convenient access, and toilet facilities are available there. The village of Manorbier also has several places to eat, perfect for a post-beach meal or snack.

Distance from Porclew: 15 minutes, approx. 5 miles

Tenby

Tenby is home to four beaches: the two main beaches—North Beach and South Beach—at either end of the town, along with Harbour Beach and Castle Beach. Situated right in the heart of Tenby, all are close to plenty of restaurants, cafés, and ice-cream parlours.

North Beach stretches along the town's main shopping area and is relatively sheltered. It is famous for the iconic Goscar Rock and offers lovely views over Carmarthen Bay. The closest car park is North Beach car park (SA70 8AG), though there are other parking options and a daily park-and-ride service operating in the summer.

South Beach runs along The Esplanade for about a mile and a half, offering a beautiful stretch of sand with plenty of space for family fun. It looks out towards Caldey Island and is ideal for a full day at the beach. The nearest car park is South Beach (SA70 7EG), and there are toilets, cafés, and restaurants at the north end of the beach.

Castle Beach is a smaller, more secluded sandy beach near the harbour. At low tide, boat trips to Caldey Island or fishing excursions can be arranged, with tickets available at the harbour. Toilets are on site, and the nearest parking is Tenby Multistorey (SA70 7LT). During busy

summer periods, the daily park-and-ride service from The Green car park (SA70 7NG) or The Salterns car park (SA70 8DU) is a good alternative.

Harbour Beach is a small, sandy beach perfect for families with young children. It is accessed via the harbour slipway, with nearby toilets and parking at Tenby Multistorey (SA70 7LT). Distance from Porclew: 22 minutes, approx. 8 miles

Saundersfoot

Saundersfoot Beach is a spacious, flat sandy beach perfect for families and easily accessible. It's great for rock pooling, sea fishing, and various water sports, with equipment hire available at the nearby harbour.

The beach sits next to the bustling harbour and the charming seaside town of Saundersfoot, which offers plenty of cafés, pubs, shops, and restaurants. Toilet facilities are close by, and the nearest car park is at the Harbour (SA69 9HE).

Distance from Porclew: 25 minutes, approx. 11 miles

WALKING

The Pembrokeshire Coast National Park's coastal footpath runs for approximately 186 miles, stretching from Amroth to Poppit Sands near Cardigan. It showcases some of the finest cliff scenery in Europe and is home to a diverse range of wildlife.

You can join the path at Freshwater East, or take the Coastal Cruiser shuttle bus to the next village and enjoy a walk back along the coast.

CASTLES

Pembroke Castle

Built around 1093 and the birthplace of Henry VII, Pembroke Castle has a fascinating history. The castle is usually open all year with free daily tours. Take in the Great Keep, climb up to the Dungeon Tower and then venture down to the depths of Wogan Cavern. There are lots of activities for children during the school holidays including Knight School. There is a café and shop on site.

Distance from Porclew: 10 minutes, approx. 4 miles

As previously mentioned this small castle sits overlooking the beautiful unspoilt bay. The impressive Great Hall, Chapel and Turrets are dotted with life-size figures. The gardens are a beautiful peaceful setting and there is also a cafe on site.

Distance from Porclew: 14 minutes, approx. 6 miles

Carew Castle and Tidal Mill

Carew Castle's rich history spans over 2,000 years and with a packed programme of events throughout the year, it is definitely worth a visit. Inside the castle there is a café and a shop. There is also a mile-long circular walk, suitable for buggies and wheelchairs, around the tidal millpond. The causeway outside the Tidal Mill is one of the best spots for crab catching in Pembrokeshire! The best times for catching crabs are around high tide when the Millpond is full and all the kit you need is available from the Mill Shop.

Distance from Porclew: 12 minutes, approx. 5 miles

TOWNS AND VILLAGES

Pembrokeshire is full of places to explore — from charming Welsh villages to medieval towns full of history — each rich in local character and community spirit. Here are just a few of our favourites.

St. David's

St. David's is named after the patron saint of Wales, Saint David and is Britain's smallest city. There is a magnificent cathedral at St. David's which dates back to the 12th century. The cathedral hosts many events throughout the year from music concerts to art exhibitions. It's narrow streets are filled with cafes, restaurants, shops and art galleries. Just outside of St. David's is Dr Beynon's Bug farm, an all-weather visitor and research centre all about invertebrates, wildlife conservation, food and farming.

Narberth

Narberth is a charming little market town with a bustling high street packed with independent shops selling a whole range of exquisite items from clothes to antiques and fine art. Multicoloured Edwardian and Georgian buildings line the high street and a beautiful clock tower stands proud in the centre of the town. There are a wide selection of independent restaurants, cafes and pubs, offering plenty of opportunities to buy locally sourced treats. In 2025, The Guardian included it in its top 10 British towns and cities for Christmas shopping with a local touch, and in 2024 The Sunday Times hailed it as one of the best places to live.

Distance from Porclew: 31 minutes, approx. 15 miles

Laugharne

Laugharne (pronounced Larne) is located on the coast just on the estuary where the River Taf flows into Carmarthen Bay. It is famous for being the home of the Welsh poet Dylan Thomas where he lived on and off for two decades until his death in 1953. The Boathouse, where Dylan Thomas and his wife Caitlin lived, is now a museum, shop and tearoom. There are numerous walks around Laugharne including 'Dylan's Birthday Walk' which is approximately 3 miles long. Laugharne is also home to a picturesque medieval castle built in the 13th century.

Distance from Porclew: 43 minutes, approx. 24 miles

Milford Haven

Milford Haven was once one of the country's biggest fishing ports and was developed as a whaling town in the late 17th century. Today Milford Waterfront is home to boutique shops selling local art pieces, jewellery, clothing, homeware and much more. There are also a selection of restaurants and cafes. Milford Waterfront hosts events throughout the year including food festivals and a weekly parkrun. There is also an award-winning Museum based on the waterfront which explores the town's rich history.

Distance from Porclew: 30 minutes, approx. 13 miles

For a different adventure, try driving a 4x4 through the beautiful ancient woodlands at Wood Park Off-Road near Haverfordwest.
